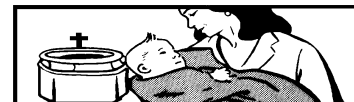
CHILDREN’S CHOIR

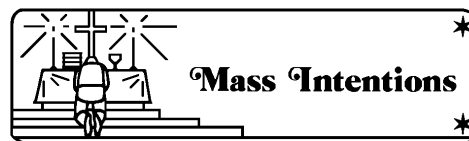
